To best support the **VCBlend**, we've introduced an internationally renowned online Learning Management System re-branded as **VCLearn**. **VCLearn** is an online learning platform that enables students to apply theory to real life scenarios.

Students and lecturers can focus on Digital literacies and fluencies as new digital learning media and Web 2.0 and 3.0 applications are incorporated into **VCLearn**.

Lecturers can draw on technologies during lectures and engage with students, both inside and outside the lecture room through online spaces like **VCLearn** and Blogs.

Every student has a voice in the learning community and an opportunity to collaborate, create and critically reflect. The result? A set of skills that will help students demonstrate their theoretical knowledge in practice – a decided advantage in the job market.



MOOCs

These are Massive, Open, Online Courses offered by highly reputable institutions – including The IIE's Varsity College. The courses range from a few days to a few months and are either self-paced or guided by an online tutor.

Key to the **VCBlend** is access to technology for students and lecturers alike. All campuses have Fibre, or an equivalent, creating high-speed Campus Hotspot Zones (CHZs).

CHZs ensure connectivity and enable the **VCBlend** beyond the lecture room, creating an authentic blended learning experience.

To support this new learning mode, students are encouraged to BYOT – Bring Your Own Technology.

For those who don't own terminals, computer labs and devices in the library ensure access.

The IIE's VC Mobile App gives direct access to VCLearn anytime, anywhere on our CHZ.

Through cloud-based learning, mediated online and interactive F2F sessions, students are encouraged to access **VCLearn**, making them active participants in the learning process.

SAICA is the foremost accountancy body in South Africa and one of the leading institutes in the world, playing an influential role in a highly dynamic business sector.





Smaller Classes

Keeping you on Track


Up to Speed

Academic Teams



Head: Academics and Programme Managers

At the helm of the academic team is the Head of Academics and the relevant Programme Manager (PM) of each School. By tracking results and monitoring feedback from lecturers and students, the Head of Academics and PMs ensure effective teaching and learning in the lecture rooms. The Head of Academics is responsible for the collective academic delivery on the campus and works closely with PMs to ensure appropriate and relevant teaching, learning and support.

Academic Support

Working closely with the Head of Academics and PMs are Teaching and Learning Specialists – passionate education experts who collaborate with students and lecturers.

Students need the skills and academic literacy to develop their ability to write effectively using informed sources, and to reflect critically on new knowledge. Should you find yourself facing challenges, a member of the academic team is there to assist you at any time.

Whether it's time management, study skills, assignment writing, applying the correct referencing techniques to avoid plagiarism, or exam preparation, students who use these services tend to show a marked improvement in their results and reap the benefit of more personalised attention.

Our Teaching and Learning Specialists also identify and nurture best teaching practice in lecturers, and conduct peer reviews evaluating teaching skills with the aim of improving delivery to students.

Permanent Lecturers


SRMs are qualified on-campus counsellors who listen, understand and treat conversations with the utmost confidentiality. They are registered health professionals who promote the holistic development of students, focusing on trauma support, wellbeing, citizenship and community engagement, and are assisted by the VC Cares Committee and student volunteer body.

Student Wellbeing

In addition to one-on-one consultations, SRMs are responsible for the social, emotional, intellectual and physical wellbeing of students on campus.

Students are encouraged to participate in awareness campaigns around substance abuse, physical and mental health, family matters, gender issues and the environment. SRMs also run mentorship programmes and life skills workshops like VC101 that prepare students for the tertiary environment, and the Girltalk Programme where female students discuss women's issues.

Through support measures, and by tending to the social and emotional aspects of life, we can equip students with crucial life skills that will help them thrive personally and socially.







Learning goes beyond the lecture room. We believe that finding the right balance between academics, sports and social activities contributes to overall academic success. That's why our student offering includes a variety of activities.

VC Sports Club Committee

The VC Sports Club is managed by the Campus Sports Coordinator who appoints Club Administrators to run each Sports Club. Passionate students who have the knowledge and admin skills can be appointed Sports Club Administrator, and will be responsible for organising training, scheduling racing opportunities, confirming team lists and supporting beginners.
